CPC Education Programme for EMTs



Context:

Based on feedback and enquiries that we have received from PHECC Emergency Medical Technicians over the last twelve months, we have found that a number of EMTs registered in Ireland have been finding it difficult to remain current and compliant with their Continual Professional Competency requirements. This may be down to limited availability (i.e. – personal commitments, work constraints, etc), lack of patient contacts on shifts (paid or unpaid/voluntary) and/or difficulty accessing clinical placements. Given the dual aspect to our work, being both a training provider (PHECC Recognised Institution, NAEMT Training Site, AHA/IHF Training Site) and an Ambulance Service, we felt that we were in a position to address this difficulty in a direct and succinct manner. This has led us to develop a Continual Professional Competence Education Programme for PHECC EMTs.

Purpose:

This programme has been developed to enable PHECC Registered Emergency Medical Technicians comply with their Continual Professional Competence requirements. Currently, the requirement is 18 CPC points a year (54 points over a three-year period).

CPC Requirements:

Your CPC requirements are broken into two sections:

- 1. Practice Status, involving:
 - a. A statement of context:
 - i. This is an introductory statement explaining the context in which you collect evidence and record experience as a practicing EMT.
 - ii. You must include this statement of context as the first part of your learning portfolio.
 - b. Evidence of at least 12 patient contacts per year
 - c. Evidence of your current CPG status
- 2. Compulsory requirement including self-selected options:
 - a. Cardiac First Response (CFR):
 - i. Two points required per year:
 - Initial certification is part of EMT course and does not count towards CPC
 - One year into each two year CFR Advanced certificate, CFR Refresher training required
 - 3. Every two years, CFR Advanced must be completed again
 - b. Mentor Mentee:
 - i. Four points required per year
 - ii. Mentoring a student or being mentored on any experiential/operational ambulance, response vehicle placement
 - iii. One point per hour mentored/mentoring
 - c. Reflective practice/Case studies:
 - i. Four points required per year
 - ii. Reflective practice:
 - 1. A document containing key learning points
 - 2. Two points per document
 - iii. Case study:
 - A Case Study on an incident, condition or injury you have encountered

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- 2. Two points per document
- iv. Can be either two Reflective Practice documents, two Case Studies or one Reflective Practice document and one Case Study
- d. Self selected options:
 - i. Eight points required per year
 - ii. Can be any one of the following (or a combination of one or more):
 - 1. Courses
 - a. One point per hour
 - b. Can be single course or multiple short courses
 - 2. Seminars
 - a. One point per hour
 - b. Must be relevant to role in Pre-hospital
 - 3. Related activities
 - a. Includes:
 - i. Electronic learning:
 - 1. One point per hour
 - 2. Must be related to practice
 - ii. Journal article review:
 - 1. Two points per article

How does the programme help you meet the CPC Requirements:

Your CPC requirements are broken into two sections:

- 1. Practice Status, involving:
 - a. A statement of context:
 - i. We can assist you in writing this statement, if required
 - b. Evidence of at least 12 patient contacts per year
 - i. During your clinical placements, you will achieve a minimum of twelve patient contacts
 - c. Evidence of your current CPG status
 - i. In any year where PHECC releases an updated version of the CPGs, you will be able to attend one of our CPG Upskilling training days
- 2. Compulsory requirement including self-selected options:
 - a. Cardiac First Response (CFR):
 - i. Two points required per year:
 - ii. Where you are one year into each two year CFR Advanced certificate, CFR Refresher will be included
 - Where your CFR Advanced certificate is expiring, CFR Advanced will be included
 - b. Mentor Mentee:
 - i. Four points required per year
 - ii. During your clinical placements, you will be being mentored by the ambulance crew, fulfilling this requirement
 - c. Reflective practice/Case studies:
 - i. Four points required per year
 - ii. While you are on your clinical placements, you will be assisted by the ambulance crew with your Case Studies/Reflective Practice documents
 - d. Self selected options:
 - i. Eight points required per year
 - ii. Included in the programme is one of our Specialist Advanced courses, each of which earns you a minimum of eight points

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Programme Content:

The programme contains the following elements:

- 1. Clinical placements:
 - a. Four shifts on one of our ambulances
 - b. Each shift will average at ten hours
 - c. Mentoring by Ambulance Crew during shifts
 - d. Assistance with Case Studies/Reflective Practice during shifts
 - e. Minimum of twelve patient contacts (Additional shifts will be arranged where twelve patient contacts are not achieved during the original allotment of four shifts, though this would be uncommon)
- 2. Cardiac First Response (CFR) Recertification or Refresher, as required
- 3. One of our Specialist Advanced Courses:
 - a. ACLS Advanced Cardiac Life Support
 - b. PALS Pediatric Advanced Life Support
 - c. PEARS Pediatric Emergency Assessment, Recognition and Stabilisation
 - d. AMLS Advanced Medical Life Support
 - e. PHTLS Pre-Hospital Trauma Life Support
- 4. CPG Upskilling, where necessitated by release of updated CPGs by PHECC
- 5. Medicall Polo-shirt for use during clinical placements
- 6. Medicall ID Badge for use during clinical placements

Programme Requirements:

Participants are required to complete the following:

- 1. A Garda Vetting Form must be completed and submitted prior to clinical placements
- 2. Copies of PHECC Qualification Certificate, Registration Certificate and Registration Licence must be supplied before first placement
- 3. A photograph should be emailed in prior to first clinical placement to allow for printing of ID Badge
- 4. A copy of Patient Handling certificate must be supplied before first placement
- 5. A copy of CFR-Advanced certificate must be supplied before first placement
